


Aligning Text for Printing


When previewing a document for distribution, you may notice text that is out of alignment. Follow these steps to realign the text at the source.

Keep in mind each instance of misaligned text must be evaluated individually because there are many factors, including your own screen resolution, that influence where text breaks in a document. As you get more familiar with your screen resolution and where the text breaks, you should be able to estimate these adjustments more easily.

1. Starting on the document preview, identify where the text is misaligned and where the line break should be




- 2. Navigate to the source text (you may be able to hotspot)
- Place your cursor where you determined the line break should be
- 4. Press the Enter key



With the cursor still in place, press the **Tab** key until the text is properly aligned


NOTE: in most cases, you should only have to **Tab** once.

6. When the text is aligned, click the **OK** button



7. Navigate back to the document preview to verify you got the desired result
