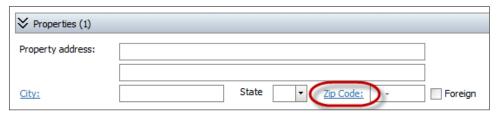


Lookup tables are a convenient way to pull in previously saved entries, which saves you time. This job aid describes:

A. Selecting an entry from a lookup table

A. Selecting an entry from a lookup table

1. Click the blue link (or in the field press the F9 key)



2. Retrieve an entry in the table by doing the following:

Mouse

Double-click a row or

- a) Highlight the row
- b) Click the Retrieve Entry button

Keyboard

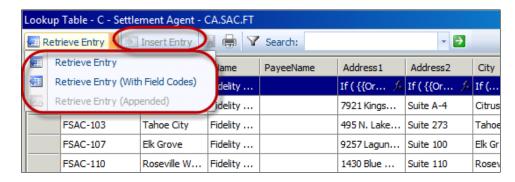
- a) Press the Tab key
- b) Use the arrow keys within the grid to highlight a row
- c) Press the Enter key (or press Alt + R)





B. Retrieving Options

When retrieving an entry from a lookup table, there are four options.

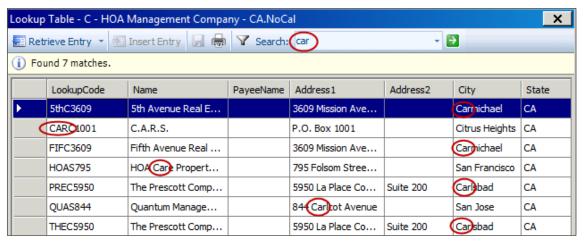


Button	Keyboard shortcut	Action	When to use
Retrieve Entry	Alt + R	Retrieves the selected entry from the list placing the information in the order	Used most often
Retrieve Entry (With Field Codes)	Alt + E	Retrieves the selected entry from the list placing the information in the order without any prompts; data retrieved includes field codes	Used to correct field codes
Retrieve Entry (Appended)	Alt + T	Retrieves the selected entry from the list allowing you to go back to select a second entry from the same lookup table to be inserted into the same text field	Used primarily by Title in the Exceptions and Requirements lookup tables
Insert Entry (permission-based)	Alt + N	Inserts a new entry from the order into the lookup table	Inserts all new entries at the bottom of the lookup table list

C. Quick Searching Lookup Tables

The Quick Search feature searches all fields in the table, returning all matches.

- 1. In the Search field, enter a keyword (or the first few characters of a keyword)
- 2. Click the Execute icon (or press the Enter key)



3. Retrieve the appropriate entry from the results



Quick Search Tips

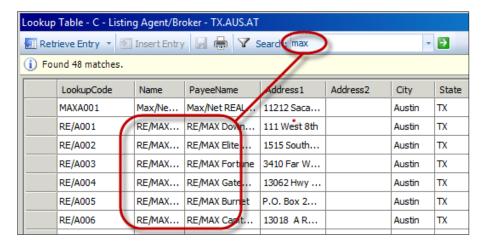
Multiple Words – When searching for a name with multiple words, place the name in quotes. Otherwise the system searches for each word independently from the other. In our example, we are searching for First Ever Savings & Loan.

"first ever" in quotes = 1 match

first ever without quotes = 9 matches (because each word is searched independently)

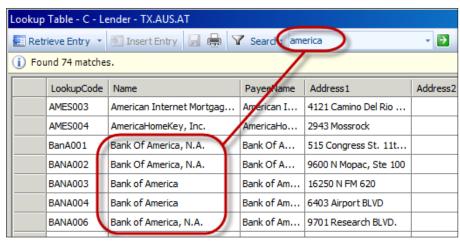

Symbols – Symbols are not searchable. For example, in Re/Max, the forward slash (/) is not searchable. The best way to search for Re/Max is to search for *max*.



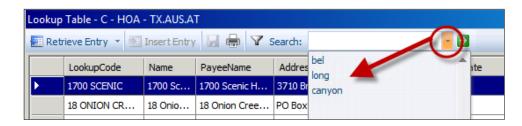
Generic Words – Most prepositions, articles, and pronouns are not searchable. For example, in Bank of America the preposition "of" is not searchable. The best way to search for Bank of America is to search for the most unique word in the name. In our case, *america*.

The Search field retains all search criteria entered for that lookup table until you log off. Click the dropdown arrow to re-run a previous Quick search.



D. Filtering Lookup Tables

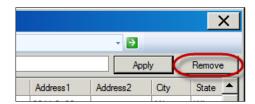
The Filter feature allows you to narrow the search results based on specific criteria in specific fields. Symbols and generic words do **NOT** apply when using the filter.

- 1. Click the Show Filter icon
- 2. From the drop-downs, select a filter and parameter; enter criteria; click Apply



3. Retrieve the appropriate entry from the results

The Remove button returns the full list.
